1. Introduction

purely on merit basis.

Vacant seats under the Govt. Merit quota after the date fixed for the completion of admission will be treated as lapsed seats and will be filled up by the management from among the applications received from eligible candidates.

4. Eligibility for Admission

1. Candidates must be citizens of India

2. Candidates who have passed Higher Secondary Examination, Kerala or examinations recognized as equivalent thereto with 50% marks in Biology/Mathematics separately and 50% marks in Physics, Chemistry and Biology/ Mathematics put together are eligible. Candidates who have passed their qualifying examinations from the states other than Kerala shall produce the certificate of recognition and equivalence of qualifying examination.

3. The applicant should have completed 17 years of age as on 31.05.2023. There is no upper age limit for B. Pharm course.

5. How to Apply

Candidates shall apply online through the link available in the college website www.caritascollege.edu.in. Application fee of Rs 500 can be remitted online.

A hard copy of the application along with the copy of the qualifying examination mark list, copy of age proof should be submitted to the college before the last date.

6. Preparation of Rank List for admission to Management quota seat

The marks obtained by the candidates in the relevant subjects in the qualifying examination conducted by various Boards or authority of other states shall be equated with the marks obtained by the candidates in the same subjects in the qualifying examination conducted by the Director of HSE, Kerala. Marks obtained by the candidates under various streams of examinations such as HSE in Kerala/CBSE/ICSE etc. will be subject to the process of normalization.

Explanation: Under the method of normalization, the highest mark obtained by students of various Boards in each subject shall be equated to the highest mark obtained by the students of the Kerala Higher Secondary examination in that subject and the relative marks obtained by other students in that subject shall be determined accordingly.

Illustration: If the highest marks secured by the applicant of the Kerala state HSE, in Physics is 100 and the highest mark secured by a applicant on any other board in the same subject is 90, both the highest marks will be considered to be equal to 100, if an applicant of the other board secures 60 marks in Physics when the highest mark in Physics in the same board is 90, the 60 marks will be considered to be equal to 66.67marks as arrived at below:

100 X 60/ 90 =66.66%

Rank list for admission to B Pharm Course under management quota seat is prepared on the basis of the marks obtained in Physics and Chemistry put together in the second year of the qualifying examination. The index mark is computed out of 100. In the case of a tie in the index mark computed for the preparation of B Pharm rank list the candidate with the higher mark in chemistry in the second year of the qualifying examination put together will be placed higher in the ranking. If there is still a tie, the age of the candidate will be considered, and the elder candidate will be placed higher in the ranking.

8. Procedure of Admission

Selected candidates shall take admission at the appointed time and date in the college after paying the Tuition fee, Caution Deposit and Special fee etc. as mentioned in the clause-11, failing which, the offer of admission will be cancelled.

9. Mode of payment:

Fees can be paid by online mode through the link given in our website. SC/ST candidates will have to pay the normal fees. The fees will be refunded as and when the Government reimburses their fees to the college.

12. Discontinuation of course and payment of liquidated damages

If any admitted candidate leaves the College after the notified closing date of admission, the candidate has to pay liquidated damages to the tune of full fee of the course subject to the scrutiny and decision of the Admission and Fee Regulatory Committee for Medical Education in Kerala/Courts of Law.

13. Code of Conduct

Every student is required to adhere strictly to the code of conduct of the institution.

14. Caution: Prohibition of Ragging

Ragging/ any type of misconduct towards any students either in the college campus or outside will be considered as a criminal offence and will be immediately reported to the police. Perpetrators will not be permitted to continue their study. Every student shall at the time of admission furnish a character certificate from the institute where from he/ she has passed the qualifying examination/the course last attended. Such a certificate should mention the status of his /her behavioral pattern especially in terms as to whether he/she had displayed persistent violent or aggressive behavior or any desire to harm others.
